Our school takes pride in its uniform, which symbolises unity, equality, and a sense of belonging to our educational community. Wearing our uniform instils a sense of pride and professionalism, fostering an optimal mindset for learning. Hence, we expect all students to adhere to our official school uniform guidelines while attending school.

Mair & Accessories:

- Hair, if coloured, should retain a natural appearance.
- For health and safety purposes, hair that falls below shoulder-length needs to be tied back.
- Hair accessories should be understated and align with our school colours, which are grey and burgundy. Black or white accessories are also acceptable.
- Please save large bows, glittery headbands, and similar items for non-uniform days.

Piercings:

- Students are permitted to wear up to two ear studs.
- These must be removed during P.E. and OWL for safety reasons.
- If your child cannot do this independently, your assistance will be required.

Non-Uniform Days:

Non-uniform days offer an opportunity for children to express their individuality, but it should be done appropriately. It's essential to remember that school remains a professional environment, for children aged 4-11 and professionals from various fields.

To ensure a conducive and respectful environment, the following clothing items are not acceptable:

- See-through clothing, such as see-through blouses;
- Strapless or 'string-strapped' tops;
- Revealing attire, like clothes that expose bare midriffs;
- Baseball caps;
- Clothing that exposes underwear;
- Flip-flops or backless footwear, due to health and safety concerns;
- Clothing featuring offensive logos.

- We may contact you to discuss how we can help, and provide a suitable time-frame to resolve the issue.
- We may offer an alternative action and/or suggest options to resolve the matter.
- We may put you in touch with Miss Poole who can loan school uniforms on a short-term basis.
- We may refer the matter to other professionals, including the Early Help Service.
